Ākonga Māori and Pacific looking to learn a trade can apply for a Māori and Pasifika Trades Training (MPTT) scholarship to cover full fees and course-related costs.

Tautoko while studying

Māori and Pasifika Trades Training scholarship students are supported at both Whitireia and WelTec through the Tamaiti Whāngai team.

The Tamaiti Whāngai team will support you with mentoring, goal setting, pastoral and cultural support. You'll have the opportunity to get your drivers license and first aid certificates. The dedicated Tamaiti Whāngai Job Brokers have close links with employers and industry and will assist you to find an apprenticeship and/or employment.

Programmes where you can get a Māori and Pasifika Trades Training scholarship include: Automotive, Bakery, Cookery, Collision Repair, Construction, Electrical Engineering, Hairdressing, Makeup and Skincare, Plumbing, Gasfitting and Drainlaying, Painting and Decorating, and Tiling.

Scholarship criteria

You need to meet the entry criteria for the programme you are enrolling in and be:

- of Māori or Pacific descent
- 16-40 years old at the start of your study
- a New Zealand citizen or permanent resident
- able to meet the entry requirements for your programme

New Zealand Certificate in Automotive Refinishing

Level 3

Petone Campus

(S) Full-time: 17 weeks

Discover the basics of automotive engineering. Learn how to use tools to complete basic engineering tasks, perform minor servicing tasks on engines and driveline systems and apply fundamental knowledge by completing tasks on automotive systems including electrical. This programme will set you up to start an automotive engineering apprenticeship.

Learn the fundamental skills suitable for those who wish to enter the automotive refinishing industry. Ākonga will be taught how to repair minor surface damage and prepare vehicle components for the refinishing process in a supervised setting. Completing this programme allows ākonga to start an apprenticeship. Ākonga will learn to follow workplace policies, procedures and relevant regulations to work safely and effectively in the automotive collision repair industry.

New Zealand Certificate in Collision Repair

Level 3

Petone Campus

(S) Full-time: 17 weeks

Learn the fundamental skills suitable for those who wish to enter the automotive collision repair industry. Ākonga will be taught how to remove and replace vehicle components to repair minor damage in a supervised setting. Completing this programme allows ākonga to start an apprenticeship. Ākonga will learn to follow workplace policies, procedures and relevant regulations to work safely and effectively in the automotive collision repair industry.

Construction Trades

New Zealand Certificate in Construction Trade Skills (Carpentry)

Level 3

Whitireia Porirua Campus, Construction Campus Petone

O Full-time: 1 year

Study the certificate in carpentry and get skills that are in high demand. Learn skills that will get you ready to enter the industry as a labourer or an apprentice. You'll learn how to safely use carpentry hand and power tools while carrying out a building project, getting the core skills to enter the industry.

New Zealand Certificate in Construction Trade Skills (Plastering)

Level 3

O Construction Campus Petone

(S) Full-time: 17 weeks

Develop plastering skills so you can start working in the industry right away. This programme will teach ākonga how to use a variety of plastering compounds and tools for both interior and exterior work. Ākonga will complete practical projects, and gain safe worksite skills in workshops under the supervision of expert tutors.

New Zealand Certificate in Construction Trade Skills (Painting and Decorating)

Level 3

Onstruction Campus Petone

(S) Full-time: 17 weeks

Get skills to be able to professionally prepare surfaces and paint interior and exterior materials. This programme allows ākonga to practice on real projects, developing skills in painting and decorating. Ākonga will also learn safe worksite skills in preparation for working in the painting industry.

New Zealand Certificate in Construction Trade Skills (Tiling)

Level 3

O Construction Campus Petone

(1) Full-time: 17 weeks

Get the introductory skills that will set you up as a successful tiler. Develop skills around tiling techniques, including design for indoor and outdoor installations. You'll become familiar working various materials; ceramic tiles, waterproofing membrane, grouts, and tile trims. After qualifying from this programme, ākonga can then go on to an apprenticeship.

New Zealand Certificate in Plumbing, Gasfitting and Drainlaying

Level 3

Petone Campus

(1) Full-time: 17 weeks

Take the first step in getting ready for an apprenticeship. Learn basic skills and procedures in plumbing, gasfitting and drainlaying by assisting with installations in each area. Learn how to apply ethical and legal practices and how to identify hazards when completing jobs.


New Zealand Certificate in Electrical Pre-Trade

Level 3

Petone Campus

I Full-time: 1 year

Study basic electrical practical and theory and start your journey to become a qualified electrician. Learn how to install cables and electrical equipment, along with applying safe working procedures in a supervised setting. Completion of this programme will allow you to enter into an apprenticeship in the electrical industry.

Finding university wasn't right for her, Natalia changed paths and enrolled in the Certificate in Plumbing, Gasfitting and Drainlaying at WelTec.

She received quality steel-cap boots which she still uses. The scholarship also helped Natalia get her driver's licence.

Makeup Artistry

New Zealand Certificate in Skin Care and Cosmetics

Level 3

Petone Campus

(S) Full-time: 17 weeks

Gain hands-on experience and learn practical skills in skincare routines, maintenance, and both classic and trending makeup techniques. Learn to develop client consultation skills, product knowledge recommendations through an introduction to basic beauty services and other key skills in communication, professionalism, and sales strategies.

This programme is a pathway to study in our Level 4 Makeup Artistry and Hairstyling or Beauty Therapy programmes.

Hairdressing

New Zealand Certificate in Hairdressing (Salon Support)

Level 3

Petone Campus. Whitireia Porirua Campus

⑤ Full-time: 1 year

Learn essential skills such as shampooing, applying treatments or colours under supervision, as well as styling and reception duties. You'll also be introduced to cutting. Develop experience working as a team member in our salon. Take the opportunity to work on other productions and fashion events.



From a young age, Sophie Tanirau had always liked cutting hair, experimenting with different looks on herself and others. After completing a Gateway programme that had her working at a local salon, Sophie was introduced to everyday life in a hair salon, and her passion for the craft grew. The next year, Sophie enrolled in the Level 3 Hairdressing programme at Whitireia and WelTec, where she was also awarded the Māori and Pasifika Trades Training (MPTT) scholarship. Now, Sophie is loving work as a full-time apprentice hairdresser at Balliage Hair Salon in Wellington's busy CBD.

Sophie was encouraged to apply for the MPTT scholarship by a member of the team, just several days into the hairdressing course. The application process required Sophie to answer questions about why she thought she deserved the scholarship, and how it would benefit her. After a meeting with the MPTT team, Sophie was awarded the scholarship.

As well as financial assistance, the MPTT scholarship enables recipients to access mentoring from the MPTT team. Over the course of the year, Sophie was able to pop

in to talk to the team about anything on her mind—from financial strains like transport costs, emotional support, or just a catchup. They provided a welcoming environment and a listening ear to Sophie whenever she needed it.

At the end of the year, Sophie and her mum attended the MPTT graduation alongside other MPTT graduates of trades, hospitality and hair and beauty programmes. Sophie was gifted tools to help her continue to hone her skills and step into the industry with confidence, like hair products, straighteners and curling irons.

Now, Sophie is a full-time apprentice at Balliage Hair Salon. She spends her time cleaning, assisting the hairdressers, washing and styling, and is currently working up to cutting and colouring. As the sole apprentice at the salon, Sophie is grateful to be surrounded by so many talented people who are happy to share their knowledge and experience. "Collectively, almost all of the stylists are training me. I feel grateful to learn from so many skilled hairdressers."

New Zealand Certificate in Bakery (Generalist)

Level 4

As well as learning culinary techniques, complex dishes, larder, and basic pastry, you'll also gain an understanding of catering operations, nutrition, and sustainable practices.

Māori and Pasifika Trades Training **Scholarship Application Form**

Who can apply

You must be:

- Of Māori or Pasifika descent
- 16-40 years of age at the start of your study
- A New Zealand citizen or New Zealand permanent resident
- Able to meet the entry criteria of the programme

Selection criteria

Applicants will be chosen because they:

- Show a genuine desire to succeed in their chosen trades programme
- Are committed to completing both the practical and theory components of the programme
- Are keen to get employment in one of the industries our programmes prepare students for
- Are committed to Pasifika group, hapū, iwi and/or Māori workforce development

Selection process

The selection panel will create a shortlist from the information you provide in your scholarship application based on the selection criteria listed above. Shortlisted applicants may be asked to attend an interview.

Selection conditions

- Scholarships will be awarded on the basis that the information supplied is true and correct. Whitireia and WelTec - a business division of Te Pūkenga can withdraw the scholarship if the information is proved to be inaccurate or incomplete.
- If you turn down the scholarship, or do not accept the scholarship by the required date, the selection panel may offer the scholarship to another applicant. The scholarship is for study in 2026.
- The decision of the selection panel is final.
