STEPS TO ENROL

We recommend you apply through one of our registered recruitment agents using the process below. Download the enrolment form from institution website **whitireiaweltec.ac.nz/international-students**



Apply to enrol

Email the completed form with the required certified documents to international-admissions @wandw.ac.nz or deliver with attached documentation to the contact details provided if you are in New Zealand.

Required documents

Notarised or certified copies of Academic documents

Evidence of English language proficiency

Certified copy of proof of ID: passport copy or birth certificate

Statement of purpose

Up to date curriculum vitae

Other supporting documents (i.e employment certificates)



Application assessment

Once we receive your application, we will assess whether you meet the English language and academic entry requirements for your chosen programme.

Offer of Place

If your application is approved, we will send you an Offer of Place. This will include payment details, airport arrival and homestay accommodation information. A Conditional Offer of Place may be given, if any of the entry requirements are not met.

Fee payment

Fee payment details are included in your Offer of Place. Ensure you have read and understood the International Student Withdrawal and Refund Procedures before you make payment.



Planning for arrival

Plan to arrive in time to attend International Student Orientation. Once you have booked your flights, organise your airport pick up and homestay accommodation at least 10 working days before you arrive. Late bookings will not be accepted.

Student visa

Once we receive your fee payment, we will issue you with an official fee receipt to support your student visa application. See Immigration New Zealand's website for requirements and processes.

Support for learning difficulties, disabilities and mental health

We have dedicated, experienced staff to support you if you have (or suspect you have) learning difficulties, disabilities and/or mental health needs (anxiety/stress). The team will work with you and your tutors to provide appropriate resources and support to help facilitate a successful learning journey. Do make a time to come and see the team as soon as possible so we can ensure that all your support needs are addressed.



Immigration – Full details of visa requirements, advice on eligibility for employment in New Zealand while studying, and reporting requirements are available through the New Zealand Immigration Service website.

Visa Conditions

A student visa (or a limited visa granted for the purpose of study) is subject to conditions and any breaches must be reported to Immigration New Zealand.

Visa conditions include, but are not limited to:

- Having sufficient funds for maintenance while in New Zealand
- Attending the programme at all times unless there are genuine reasons for any absences, and making satisfactory academic progress
- Studying at the place of study specified on the student visa
- Having acceptable insurance for the duration of the student visa
- Working no more than the hours specified on the student visa

Eligibility for Health Services

Most international learners are not entitled to publicly funded health services while in New Zealand, so may be liable for the full costs of any treatment. Full details on entitlements to publicly funded health services are available through the Ministry of Health, go to www.health.govt.nz

The Accident Compensation Corporation provides accident insurance for all New Zealand citizens, residents, and temporary visitors to New Zealand, but international learners may still be liable for all other medical and related costs. For more information, go to www.acc.co.nz

Compulsory Medical and Travel Insurance

We require all enrolled international learners to have approved health and travel insurance for the duration of their enrolment (regardless of the visa type). A student visa holder is also required to have approved health and travel insurance for the duration of their visa or until they depart New Zealand, whichever comes first.

We have arrangements in place with our preferred insurance provider for international learners.

Uni-Care NZ Student Plan is the default insurance provider for international learners.

The insurance does not cover your partner and/or children. They require separate insurance. The Visitor Plan can cover up to two adults and five children.

Student applicants will be invoiced for the insurance premium during the international admissions process.



Student accommodation

There is a range of accommodation options available to you. See our website for links to information about short and long-term accommodation options. Our support team can arrange homestay accommodation for you if required.

International Orientation

Before classes officially begin, we hold orientations for international learners. You'll be able to tour the orientation campus, and become familiar with the services offered. You will meet other international classmates, tutors or the programme manager and also chat with the international team. It's the perfect way to ease into your new study journey, while potentially being able to meet new people and foster new connections.

Study Support

Our specialist international student advisor team will be able to help with any questions new or current international learners may have. It doesn't just have to be about study, the team can provide advice on any questions or concerns around adapting to studying and living in Aotearoa New Zealand. Other pieces of advice our team are able to give include:

- student visa and insurance information
- programme advice
- tuition fees
- homesickness or cultural questions around adjusting to living in Aotearoa New Zealand.

Accommodation

It's important to arrange where you're going to stay before arriving in Aotearoa New Zealand. As part of our service to our international learners, the international support team can give advice around the accommodation options in the Wellington region and provide information around budgeting, rent responsibilities, furniture, and travel options to and from campus.

Bachelor of Nursing

Learn how to improve health outcomes for communities across Aotearoa. Be the person the public values and trusts while they undergo their health journey. This programme offers culturally and clinically focused experiences while offering a career in the health sector that's both challenging and rewarding.

In year one, students learn clinical skills in our simulation suites, as well as attend clinical placements in rest homes and community settings. In years two and three, students will have 14–16 weeks of clinical placement each year, in a variety of clinical settings.

Year one

Has a primary health care focus. Students are supported to become student nurses by gaining knowledge focused on concept-based learning of nursing theory and research, nursing science, Te Tiriti o Waitangi, cultural safety, sociology, communication and assessment.

Year two

The student has become an independent learner and is ready to add to the concepts gained through on-site workshops and context-based learning, with a focus on national health trends and simulated learning experiences.

Year three

The student nurse consolidates practice and theory knowledge in preparation for undertaking the roles and responsibilities of a registered nurse. Integration of knowledge, focusing on contemporary professional nursing and health issues in the local and global context, enables the student to further develop in their clinical judgement, professionalism, and leadership.

In the second semester students have an extended period in clinical practice to prepare for the Nursing Council State Final Examinations and registered nurse practice.

Bachelor of Nursing Pacific

Level 7

Afio mai, Ulu tonu mai. Turou oro mai ki te Apii Tuatoru o Whitireia. Throughout your learning journey you'll integrate your knowledge of Pacific communities, cultural practices and nursing knowledge to improve health outcomes for Pacific peoples and the wider Aotearoa New Zealand community and overseas.

On successful completion of this programme graduates receive the Bachelor of Nursing Pacific, are eligible to sit the Nursing Council State Finals, and can apply to enrol in postgraduate programmes of study.

Year one

Fakavae (Tokelau term of Fakavae, which refers to the concept of foundation).

The student will have the opportunity to gain insight into their own Pacific identity, by introducing them to Te Tiriti o Waitangi, Pacific worldviews, and values and models in the context of Aotearoa. The students will acquire core communication skills and foundational nursing skills which they will demonstrate in a diverse range of clinical and cultural learning environments that cover lifespan.

Year two

Faiā (Samoan term which signifies upholding respectful relationships)

Year two will build on the foundational knowledge and skills acquired in year one, by displaying the beginning attributes of nursing praxis, such as; effective communication, self-reflection and ability to interpret and make meaning from interactions with others across a variety of health care settings. At a beginning level, using reflection and critical thinking, the student can facilitate decision making in response to interpretation from a nurse context.

Year three

Turanga Neti (Cook Island: Neti is nurse and Turanga refers to the positions, status and responsibilities of the nursing profession)

By year three, the student is able to demonstrate that they are successfully transitioning out of their 'student role' and into the role of the beginning practitioner. They will confidently be able to move between their Pacific communities and the world of non-Pacific health care services in ways that add value to both. The year three student has become proficient in their ability to integrate nursing knowledge into professional practice. This includes the capability to demonstrate sound judgement, decision making, reflection, evaluation, professional conduct and best practice as a beginning nurse clinician.

New Zealand Diploma in Enrolled Nursing

Level 5

Whitireia Porirua Campus

start Dates: 10 February, 21 July

(S) Full-time: 18 months

Become an enrolled nurse, working under the direction of a registered nurse, to provide nursing care to individuals in community, residential and hospital settings.

The programme is a combination of theory (classroom based sessions at the Porirua campus) and supported clinical placements (practical/hands-on work), which is completed in a variety of community and hospital settings).

The programme is taught over 18 months. Students who successfully complete Part A (full year) can then enrol in Part B (half year).

Part A

Provides the foundational knowledge and skills required to enable students to work as part of the health care team with clients/patients/residents in a range of hospital and community settings.

Part B

Students enrol for six months and work towards being prepared to work effectively, efficiently and safely within a variety of broad practice areas.


