Petone Campus

We are here to support the success and participation of Māori students at WelTec. Working out of the Petone Campus the Tamaiti Whāngai team will provide mentoring, pastoral, cultural and academic support. The team will also provide advocacy internally and externally as required.

There are dedicated spaces to study, hang out and korero. Our Petone campus has Te Whare Āwhina for ākonga to come and be amongst peers while providing an area to focus on study.

Our iwi partner Te Rūnanga o Te Āti Awa also provide support to our ākonga and are regularly on campus.

Porirua Campus

Over on the Porirua campus you'll be supported by our Pou Whakamanawa (Māori Success Advisor), who will respond to any issues you may have.

Our Ako Ake Cafe in the heart of Porirua campus is a dedicated space where ākonga come to be amongst peers. It's a great space to get some study done or even have conversations around study with whānau or teachers.

Māori and Pasifika Trades Training

Māori and Pacific students looking to learn a trade can apply for a Māori and Pasifika Trades Training scholarship to cover full fees and course-related costs.

Māori and Pasifika Trades Training Scholarship students are supported by both Whitireia and WelTec through the Tamaiti Whāngai team.

The Tamaiti Whāngai team will support you with mentoring, goal setting, pastoral and cultural support. You'll have the opportunity to get your drivers license, site safe and first aid certificates. The dedicated Tamaiti Whāngai Job Brokers have close links with employers and industry and will assist you to find an apprenticeship and/or employment.

Options include* - Automotive, Bakery, Collision Repair, Construction, Electrical Engineering, Hairdressing, Makeup and Skincare, Mechanical Engineering, Plumbing, Gasfitting and Drainlaying, Painting and Decorating and Tiling.

- 16-40 years old at the start of your study

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Student **Support Pacific**

Whitireia and WelTec are leading the way in making meaningful connections with and for our Pacific akonga. By enabling a strong community presence, we can help our Pacific ākonga with the best possible study and pastoral care.

Serving students

Having been welcomed through the official powhiri and mihi whakatau, Pacific ākonga receive a Turou (welcome) and introduction to the institutes, our staff and their peers. With over 200 akonga attending a wonderful sense of belonging is created from day one!

Pacific Engagement Advisors work across our Porirua. Petone and CBD campuses. The advisors will be able to help with any study or pastoral related topics.

We have designated spaces on campus for our Pacific learners to come and be amongst peers, get some study done or even talanoa with graduates and tutors. There is the Pasifika Centre in Petone and Ako Ake Cafe in Porirua. The advisors will connect ākonga who need further support to local Pacific service organisations.

Celebrating achievement

Falarazzi is the signature event where we celebrate Pacific achievement with our wider community. It recognises not just the students' successes but is the opportunity for the whole family to get involved. Community leaders, government representatives, Pacific diplomats, alongside grandparents, children and partners all attend which gives the celebration a true community feel. It's certainly one of the most colourful events of the year!

We are proud of our relationship with Tupu Toa, Tupu Tai and key Government scholarship sponsors which allow our ākonga and graduates access to internships and post-study options. These relationships ensure our ākonga are setup to achieve the next stage of their journey.

Celebrating Pacific languages and cultures

Each year our institutes celebrate nine Pacific language weeks in partnership with Porirua City Council and local cultural communities. Ākonga across our campus' will enjoy a mix of online, face-to-face activities and food.

Working with communities

Our Pacific team are active members of their communities. They engage in local events and matters of interest, keeping up to date with the needs of the area. Our Campuses NGĀ WĀHI AKO

We have five campus locations across the Wellington region, allowing specialised and tailored learning in industry leading facilities.

The Porirua Campus is the base for many of our Health and Social Services programmes. Located just 20 minutes from Wellington City, and looking out over Titahi Bay towards Whitireia peak, the Porirua Campus is one of New Zealand's most beautiful sites for a tertiary institution.

Our Petone Campus is located in the vibrant suburb of Petone. The area is full of cafés, bars and restaurants as well as being home to the Light House Cinema, Remutaka Cycle Trail and Petone Settlers Museum.

Our Construction Campus is the biggest trades training facility in New Zealand. The campus is located on State Highway 2, just minutes from Petone railway station with lots of parking available. Students learn through tailored workshops that develop their skills in carpentry, painting, decorating and tiling. The facility opened in 2015 and is only a few minutes drive from the Kensington Avenue campus.

Our Te Auaha Campus is our creative campus that opened in 2018. Located right in the heart of Wellington City, situated on the corner of Cuba Street and Dixon Street, it's just around the corner from Wellington's best loved bars, venues, restaurants, shops, and attractions. Te Auaha facilities include two theatres, 55 seater cinema, exhibition gallery and a performance studio.

Our modern Hospitality Campus is located on Wellington's famous Cuba Street, just a 15 minute walk from Wellington railway station. Being on Cuba Street means our hospitality and culinary arts students are learning in the thick of the action - a dynamic and constantly changing environment that only the Wellington CBD can provide.

Our Training spaces WāHI WHAKANGUNGU

We have a range of facilities and services where our ākonga learn valuable skills in spaces that mimic real-life workspaces. These spaces are not only used for practical learning but provides benefits to everyone else on campus.

Simulated healthcare labs

Our Porirua campus specialises in providing the best healthcare education for our Nursing and Paramedicine ākonga. There are state-of-the-art labs on-site that simulate healthcare settings, providing our ākonga with a realistic environment in which to learn.

Café and Restaurants

In the CBD, Bistro 52 is a fully supervised restaurant where our chefs in training create delicious fine dining meals. Served and catered by our hospitality ākonga. Bistro 52 is where Wellington's future hospitality stars learn and apply their skills.

Wellington is known for its worldclass coffee, and many of our city's top baristas have come straight from the Latte Lab, located in our school of Hospitality on Cuba St. Here, our ākonga serve customers and prepare delicious coffees, smoothies, fresh juices and café food on selected dates.

Te Whare Makawe Hair on Campus

From colours to styling, our ākonga learn all the relevant hairstyling skills that will leave you looking and feeling great. Te Whare Makawe - Hair on Campus have student learning salons in Wellington, Petone and Porirua. Our training salons are run by hairdressing students, fully supervised by professional stylists. It's a great opportunity for both students and staff to give the hairdressing akonga first-hand experience in styling, while doing something nice for themselves at the same time.

Barbering studios

There are also barbering studios for those wanting to specialise in cutting and shaving. Our barbering ākonga frequently cut and shave all types of hair to create their portfolio in their journey to become professional barbers. Our professional barber shops are run by students under the expert supervision of our barbering tutors.

Aria beauty therapy

Our beauty and makeup ākonga gain skills in facial therapy, hair removal, manicure and pedicure, makeup, spray tanning, eyebrow shaping and eyelash tinting. All these skills are honed on clients wanting to give themselves some self-care.

Automotive workshops and construction sites

We have dedicated automotive workshops and house build sites for our automotive and constructions students. Our Construction Campus in Petone is the biggest trades training facility in New Zealand. Our ākonga will learn through tailored, onsite projects that will develop their skills in carpentry, painting, decorating and tiling. There are also dedicated house build sites at the Porirua campus. Whereas our automotive workshops will give learners first-hand, practical experience working in industry recognised workshops.



Youth Pathways

If you are a school ākonga and are interested in what tertiary study as all about, we have several options for you. Our various youth pathways will give you a taster of what study could be like.

Wellington Trades Academy

Enjoy the benefits of staying at school while you're learning new skills and achieving school qualifications.

Your weekly timetable will look

- · 3 or 4 days at school
- 1 or 2 days of practical learning at polytechnic

We partner with local secondary schools to provide programmes that allow you to achieve NCEA Level 2, or in some cases Level 3. This will get you ready for employment or higher-level qualifications and training.

Study fees free and be provided with subsidised travel assistance subject to meeting Ministry of Education criteria for eligible students.

Study Fee Free

NGĀ KAUPAPA AKO KORE UTU

Fees free study eligibility

If you're new to tertiary study, or you've previously done less than six months at tertiary level then you might qualify for a range of fees free study.

In order to qualify for fees free study you need to meet the following requirements:

- be allowed to work and live in New Zealand permanently, or be an Australian or New Zealand resident who has lived here for at least three years
- enrol in an eligible qualification
- not be enrolled in school when your qualification starts, and either;
- have been enrolled at school in 2020 and 2021, or
- have not previously studied or trained for more than 60 credits (except while you were at school)

Targeted Training Apprenticeship Fund (TTAF)

There are a number of programmes that are free through the Targeted Training and Apprenticeship Fund. Check out the website for more information.

TTAF makes a range of training and apprenticeship programmes free for learners. It is targeted towards industries where demand from employers for these skills will continue to be strong, or is expected to grow, during New Zealand's recovery period from the impacts of COVID-19.

With funding until December 2022, you can study in the following areas: Built Environment, Construction Trades (Carpentry, Electrical, Painting and Decorating, Plumbing, Tiling), Community Support and Wellbeing, Enrolled Nursing, Hospitality, Mechanical Engineering and Information Technology.

These programmes are FREE under TTAF, covering: compulsory tuition fees, compulsory course costs and compulsory student services fees.

Youth Guarantee

Are you 16-19 years old?

Youth Guarantee enables you to train fees free for two years in a range of practical programmes. Complete an introductory programme at level 1 or 2 and then choose from a wider selection of level 3 options.

Youth Guarantee can help cover your fees, course-related costs and travel. This could be ideal if you want to keep learning, but feel school is no longer for you.

Options include* - Automotive, Construction Trades (Carpentry, Electrical, Painting, and Decorating, Plumbing, Tiling), Cookery, Hairdressing, Hospitality, and Mechanical Engineering.

Scholarships

You could be eligible to study through a scholarship. Both Whitireia and WelTec have a number of scholarships through community connections. Check out our website for more information.



A former professional football player in the UK during his OE, he came back to New Zealand to study and create a portfolio that would get him into Weta Digital. He knew the best place to learn skills like storyboarding would be Whitireia. He started the design programme, and met his tutor in his third year. His tutor actually encouraged Lisale to look into a teaching career instead of film and entertainment. New Zealand needed more Polynesian male teachers, and she saw something in Lisale that she knew would make him an excellent teacher. After graduating Lisale went back to school to study teaching and hasn't looked back.


